

GETTING TO NASHVILLE

Driving to Nashville

Half of the US population lives within 650 miles of Nashville. It's one of only six US cities where three interstates converge, which makes Music City an accessible and strategically located destination.

Nashville International Airport

Nashville International Airport (BNA) is located approximately eight miles from downtown. It's the 29th largest commercial service airport in the United States. Flights are available to over 98 nonstop destinations, served by 17 airlines - including major carriers like American, Delta, and Southwest. And 75% of the country can be reached by plane in under two hours. Nonstop international service includes British Airways from London, Icelandair from Reykjavik, and Aer Lingus from Dublin, along with access to numerous international feeder markets.

Car Rentals

All major car rental agencies are represented at BNA and located just a short walk from the terminal.

airLINE Nashville Airport Shuttle Service

Luxury motor coaches provide airport shuttle services from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m., with pickup and drop-off at the Music City Center in downtown Nashville and at the Franklin Marriott Cool Springs in nearby Franklin, Tennessee. The shuttle returns to each location every hour. One-way tickets are \$15/person; round trip is \$25/person.



Points-of-Interest Maps

Free points-of-interest maps for key areas of the city are available at the Nashville Visitor Centers located inside Bridgestone Arena (501 Broadway) and at Fifth + Broadway (5036 Broadway). Digital maps can be found at visitmusiccity.com/maps. Copies of the Nashville Visitor Guide are also available.

Downtown Parking

Park with ease downtown using the Nashville Downtown Partnership's parking guide. With over 39,000 parking spaces available, it's so simple to bring a car downtown as you enjoy the entertainment district, the array of hotels and restaurants, and the world-famous honky-tonks of Lower Broadway.

Ride-Share

Uber and Lyft offer ride-share services in the Nashville area.

Taxis

Taxi services are available throughout Nashville by phone from a variety of companies, including Magic Taxi, Music City Taxi & Checker Cab, NashVegas Cab, and Yellow Cab. zTrip offers accessible rides. Taxi drivers must complete a customer service and city knowledge training program provided by the Nashville Convention & Visitors Corp to obtain a transportation license.

WeGo Public Transit

WeGo Public Transit operates 27 local bus routes and nine regional routes. All rides are \$2, and unlimited all-day passes are available for \$4. WeGo Central, the downtown transit station, is located next to the Nashville Municipal Auditorium.

Commuter Rail

The WeGo Star has seven stations along its route, from Lebanon (east of the city) to its final stop at Riverfront Park in downtown Nashville. Trains run Monday-Friday during peak commuter hours, with an additional late train on Fridays departing from the Riverfront Park station at 10:30 p.m.
